REV. WILLIAM REDFIELD: KEYNOTE SPEAKER FOR SPIRITUAL CARE DAY OCT. 23, 2014

Syracuse, NY-InterFaith Works of CNY will hold its 24th annual Spiritual Care Day on Thursday, Oct. 23, 2014, from 8 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., at Crouse Hospital's Marley Education Center, 765 Irving Ave., Syracuse. The Rev. William Redfield will present the keynote address, "Spiritual Self-Care for Caregivers," in which he will share the knowledge and spiritual practices he currently is teaching in his Wisdom work to help caregivers maintain a strong spiritual foundation from which to serve others.

While serving as rector of Trinity Episcopal Church in Fayetteville, NY, the Rev. Redfield established The Nancy Simmons Wisdom House, which provides a place of hospitality to those of all faith traditions and is designed to honor others through respectful dialogue, inquiry and methods of spiritual practice. Utilizing ancient practices of sacred reading, meditation, sacred movement, contemplative prayer and sacred song, *Wisdom Schools* teach focused attention, recollection, mindfulness, inner observation, non-possessiveness, inner honesty, non-identification and surrender.
